“Collecting to Teach and Teaching to Collect: The James Wilson Bright Collection”

Goucher College's James Wilson Bright Collection consists of early printed books, pamphlets and manuscripts dating from 1539-1925, which were collected by Bright, an Anglo-Saxonist and John Hopkins University professor. His collection is now supporting undergraduate instruction and scholarly research in the book as material objects. The Bright Rare Book Census Project at Goucher strives to teach students valuable skills in artifact analysis, handling rare materials, preservation and digitization, the ultimate goal being to open the collection to a wider research community both in and beyond Goucher College. Illustrations of some of the rarest and most unusual items in the collection will be highlighted during the presentation.
