### News & Notes from Here and There...

Kudos to our president, **Chris Needham**, for facilitating our August 23 field trip to **Wonder Book and Video** in Frederick, Maryland. Owner Chuck Roberts took us on a tour of the labyrinthine warehouse and its 5 million books. Our group of 16 then enjoyed lunch at Modern Asia, followed by a visit to a nearby Wonder Book retail store. Sixteen people attended, including several non-members.

**Kelmscott Bookshop:** August Newsletter. This month books and magazines in our Periodicals section will be on sale. Many books and magazines priced at or under \$75 in this section will be 50% off throughout the month of August. Please note that our sale excludes new arrivals, items sold on consignment, and private press items.

We are also featuring a selection of New York City Council Manuals from the mid-1800s on sale for 20% off through the end of August. These are commonly known as Valentine's Manuals. They were published annually by the city's <u>Common Council</u> from 1841 to 1870. They are very collectible partly because of their statistics and listings of officials, but primarily because of historical essays and images unrelated to the specific contents that were added by the compilers. These manuals are listed below. Original publications listed for sale are generally scarce.

As usual, we are highlighting our new arrivals for the month. Several are described below in the New Arrivals section, and you can view all 200 titles by visiting our <u>New Arrivals Page</u>. Highlights include works by Gustav Doré, a design binding by Pam Wood, a textile piece on talismanic shirts by Islam Aly,

an exquisite Spanish language artists' book by a Colombian book artist, an original photograph album of large format photographs of the World's Fair in 1940, a Pennyroyal Press edition of The Scarlet Letter, a powerful work on immigration and racism by Dirk Hagner, and a selection of antiquarian titles on travel and exploration.

Finally, after twenty-one years of dedicated contributions to and management for The Kelmscott Bookshop, Susannah Horrom is resigning effective Friday, August 8, to pursue the next phase of her life and career. This will be her last newsletter, but we plan to continue them in future months. Steve Durako, Fran's husband, will be taking over as the manager for the business.
