The Kelmscott Bookshop is pleased to offer a sale on women authors and women's studies through the end of September. These titles include many hard-to-find novels and volumes of poetry from authors in the late 19th and early 20th centuries.

Novels include *Nine Little Goslings*, by Susan Coolidge; *The Murder of Delicia*, by Marie Corelli; *Cecilia de Noel*, by Mary Elizabeth Hawker; *A Study in Temptations*, by Pearl Craigie (John Oliver Hobbes); *The Emperor's Candlesticks*, by Baroness Emmuska Orczy; and *Sir George Tressady*, by Mrs. Humphrey Ward (Mary Augusta Arnold).

Volumes of poetry include *Minor Chords*, by Sophia May Eckley; *Poems*, by Emily Hickey (illustrated by Mary E. Swan); *Depths and Shallows*, by Sally Bruce Kinsolving; *Poems*, by Mrs. Lyttleton F. Morgan; and *Quartman's Grace and Other Poems*, by Emily Pfeiffer.

There are also short story collections, including *Knight Asrael and Other Stories*, by U. Ashworth Taylor (fantasy stories for children) and *The Hypnotic Experiment of Dr. Reeves and Other Stories*, by Charlotte Rosalys Jones. Finally, there are interesting books in a variety of other fields. These include *The Life and Art of Lois Mailou Jones*, by herself; three works about Mother (Saint) Katherine Drexel; an anthology of Argentinian Women Writers; and a number of scholarly literary works about Dickens and other authors.
